

Activity 1 Cutting paper



Resources:

- 1) Scissors fun scissors or normal ones
- 2) Paper preferably boarder paper as it is easier to handle

Description

Cut the paper into small strips.

Threading




Resources:

- 2) Wooden disc with a hole through the centre

Description

Thread the pipe cleaner through the disk.

Activity 3 Tower building with cotton reels




Resources:

1) Cotton reels x2 or more

Description

Balance the cotton reels one on top of another.

Activity 4 Wool wrapping




Resources:

- 1) Cotton reel x1
- 2) A length of wool

Description

Wrap the wool around the cotton reel.

Threading




Resources:

- 1) Cotton reel x1
- 2) A length of wool
- 3) Pipe cleaner

Description

Begin with threading the pipe cleaner through the cotton reel. Once they are capable, progress on to using wool.

Activity 6 Play-doh stamping




Resources:

- 1) Cotton reel x1
- 2) Play-doh

Description

Make imprints in the play-doh using the cotton reel.

Activity 7 Pipe cleaner twists



Resources:

1) Pipe cleaners x2 – preferable two different colours

Description

Twist together two pipe cleaners to make twists.

Elastic band joining

Resources:

1) Elastic bands x2

Description

Stage 1. Get two elastic bands

Stage 2. Thread one band through the other

Stage 3. Hook the band back on its self

Stage 4. Pull the loose end through itself

Stage 5. Pull hard.

Activity 9 Using a bottle






Resources:

- 1) Plastic bottle
- 2) Measuring jug

Description

Ask the child to unscrew the cap of the bottle. Fill the measuring jug up with water. Pour the water into the bottle. Screw back on the cap.

Using a syringe



Resources:


- 1) syringe
- 2) container of water

Description

Add water to the container. Ask the child to empty the air out of the syringe. Put the syringe nib into the water. Pull on the syringe to suck the water in to the syringe. Progress on to adding named amounts of water in to the syringe eg. 4ml.

Activity 11

Bead threading into play-doh



Resources:


- 1) play-doh
- 2) straw
- 3) threading beads

Description

Stick a straw in to play-doh so that it stands up unsupported. Thread the beads on to the straw.

Activity 12

Bead threading on to string




Resources:

- 1) Threading string
- 2) Threading beads

Description

Tie a knot in the end of the string so that the beads don't fall off. Thread the beads on to the string.

Finger maze




Resources:

- 1) Play-doh or toy car
- 2) Lollipop sticks or straws

Description

Lay out lollipop sticks on the table in a maze or a shape. Use finger to roll a ball of play-doh around the maze. You can substitute the lollipop sticks for straws and the playdoh balls for toy cars.

Activity 14 Paper clip chains




Resources:

1) Paper clips

Description

Link the paperclips to create a paperclip chain. You could also make paperclip bracelets.

Bead run




Resources:

Description

Ask the child to move the bead from one side to the other.

Activity 16 Peg board




Resources:


- 1) Peg board

Description

Ask the child to put the pegs into the holes on the peg board.

Activity 17 Alien friends






Resources:

- 1) Straws
- 2) Playdoh
- 3) Googly eyes optional

Description

Create alien creatures using rolled up balls of playdoh and straws. Stick the straws in to the balls of playdoh to create different shaped aliens. Use the straws to poke holes in the playdoh for eyes.

Lego




Resources:

1) Lego

Description

Let them explore and make creations out of Lego.

Cube sorting with tweezers




Resources:

- 1) plastic tray

Description

Ask the child to move the dienes from one side of the tray to another. Additionally, you could ask them to sort the dienes in to different colours.

Ideas


- 1) Create a snake out of play-doh

Extra activities

- Cutting
 Spaghetti, rolled up tissue paper, straws, grass, cutting out shapes or following lines with scissor, scissor workbooks.
- Wooden puzzles.
- Tracing.
- Weaving.
- Stick buttons, pasta, paper, leaves, dried beans.
- Cotton bud painting
 Their name, shapes, letters, numbers, pictures.
- Threading beads on to pipe cleaners.
 On to ribbon, wool.
- Building
 Unifix, jenga bricks, polydrons skeleton, mobilo etc.
- Marble run.
- Lasing cards.
- Lost property spare clothing undo do-up bttons, zips buckles and laces.
