


REPORTS

Your child should have brought their report and related information home last night. If you need a duplicate copy of this information, please contact the office. The purpose of the report is to share how your child is doing in school both in terms of their attainment and efforts. I hope you find the information useful and please do take the time to complete the survey about the report on Parentmail (you can find this in the Forms section of your ParentMail account), it can be completed in seconds unless you have more detailed feedback that you would like to give us. If you wish to discuss your child's report with their teacher they will be happy to do so, you can either speak to them directly or make an appointment through the office.

SCHOOL DAY

This year we have increased the drop off window in the morning so that children can be left at school anytime between 8.40am and 9am. This was following COVID arrangements and in response to your feedback. Overall this has worked well and we had planned to keep the arrangement in place next year. However new government legislation comes into effect in 2023 about the length of the school day and therefore, **from September**, we will need to return to the original drop off window of **8.40am to 8.50am**. Unfortunately, much of our published material includes this year's times but we would ask you to note the new time



and ensure pupils are at school by 8.50am for the register please. I apologise for the short notice regarding this. Most children are currently in school by 8.50am each morning so I think the impact on families and the car parking will be minimal. It is bound to make the car park a little busier and I noted many responses

in the parent questionnaire in relation to needing more parking and inconsiderate behaviour in the car park. As ever our advice is to walk to school where possible. Where this isn't possible it is best to park in the surrounding area and walk the last part of the journey. This will often be quicker and less stressful than driving down Oswald Road. If you do use either of the car parks you should expect delays, double parking etc.
