## AIR QUALITY & ANTI-IDLING DAY

This week each year group had an assembly delivered by Kate and Amanda from Sustrans who are leading an anti-idling project at our school. They spoke about the negative impact on air quality when cars are idling (this means they are parked and still have the engine turned on). The children were shocked to learn that an idling car released the

equivalent of **150 balloons of fumes and toxic gases per minute.**

On **Wednesday 6th July**, we are encouraging all children to travel actively to school as part of the idling project we have been working on in school. If children need to come to school by car, try parking away from the school site and walking the last part of your journey.

To celebrate those who are travelling actively on Wednesday 6th July, the Year 5 and 6 Active Travel leaders will be out with the golden lock. These will be attached to random bikes and scooters around the school site. If your bike or scooter gets chosen, you will be able to collect a prize at the end of the school day from Kate and Amanda on the main playground.



Raffle tickets will be given out to all children who walk, scoot, cycle or park and stride to school on Wednesday. The raffle will be drawn throughout the school day and the winning raffle ticket numbers will be displayed at the end of the day by the ball court on the main playground. The winning children can either collect their prize on Wednesday or they will be left in classrooms to go home the following day.

Children also have the chance to win a new scooter by completing the idling competition sheets that were given out in class earlier this week. There is a wordsearch and an air quality sticky tape challenge. Miss Yelland has already had over 50 entries handed in but you still have a week left to get the challenges done. Please hand them back to your teacher by Friday 8<sup>th</sup> July for a chance to win; each completed challenge will be entered into a prize draw to win the scooter. 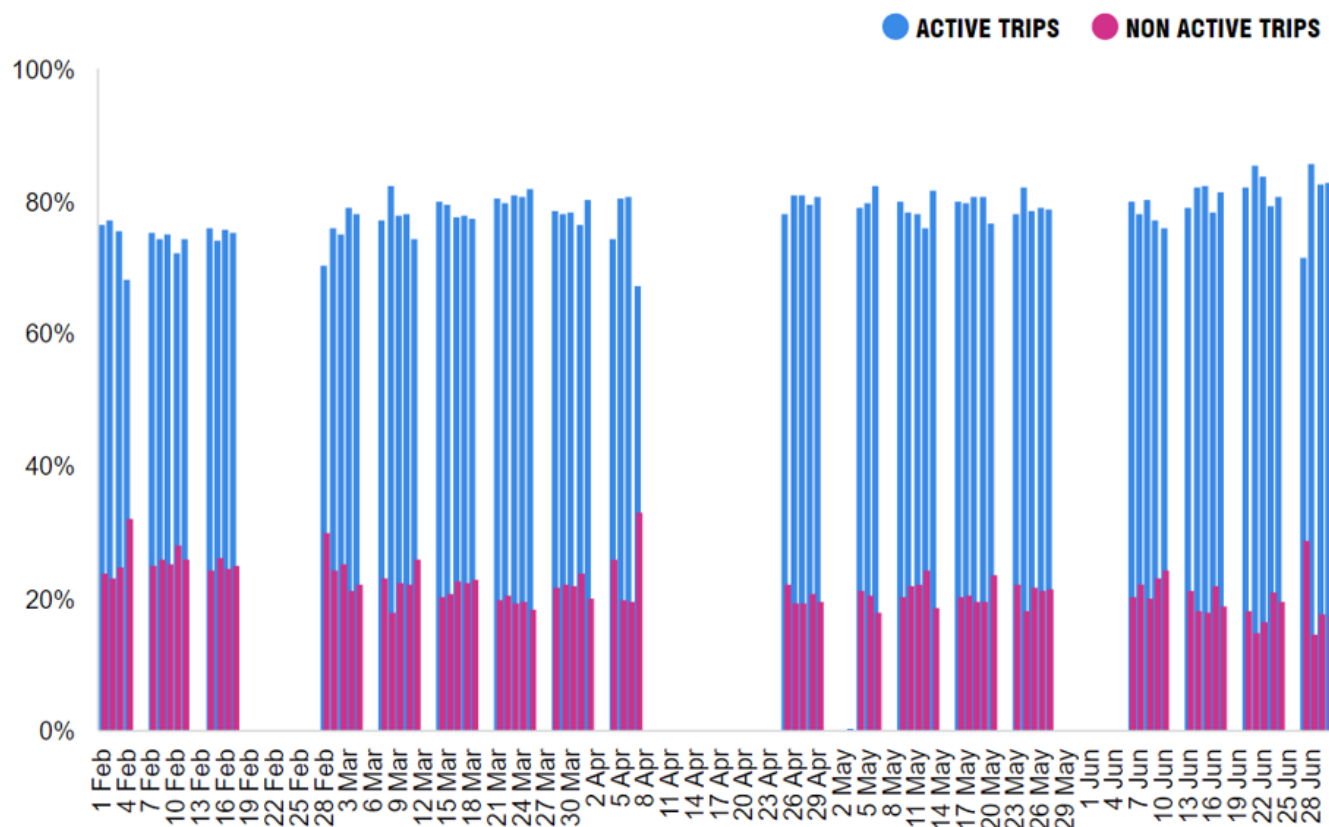
paper they are attached to the ParentMail message containing the link to this newsletter. Alternatively, your child can find Miss Yelland who has some spares!

Amanda and Kate from Sustrans who have been working with us this year will be joining us to celebrate our active travel day. They will be on the playground at the end of the school day to hand out raffle prizes and answer any questions. They will have posters and banners showing the results of our idling experiments around Winton Primary School. There will be a chance for you to make a pledge of a small change you will make to help improve the air quality at Winton.



### WOW TRACKER

We have now been using the Living Streets WOW tracker for 4 months. As a school there has been an increase in the number of people choosing to start their day with an active journey. Since February the children at Winton Primary have logged **47,159 active journeys to school**, and over 2,900 badges have been given out. There is just one month left for the WOW challenge this academic year to earn your last WOW badge. Children need at least 2 active journeys a week to earn their July badge.

# Bournemouth Commonwealth Games Trails

In Bournemouth, to celebrate and raise awareness that Birmingham is hosting the Commonwealth Games in 2022, the Bournemouth School Games team have created Commonwealth trails at 5 different sites around the town. Trail sheets and maps for each site are downloadable below or from the website <https://www.yourschoolgames.com/sgo/bournemouth/bournemouth-commonwealth-games-trails/> and paper copies will be available at each site as described.

To complete the challenges you should:

- follow the route, finding the markers (these are marked with the United by Birmingham logo shown to the right).
- complete a physical activity challenge and answer a Commonwealth Games themed question at each station.
- When you have completed the trail, use the first letter of all the answers to the questions to form a word.
- Each map will have a QR code on it, scan this and complete a sort survey to help your school win a visit from an athlete mentor.
- The school with the most entries at the end of the period will win a visit from athlete mentor Jamie Barrow, the world's fastest snowboarder!



The trails are ready to use from now until Friday 9th September.
