### **SCHOOL NURSING TEAM – PARENTLINE 5-19**

We are delighted to announce that there is now a confidential text messaging service to parents and carers of children and young people aged between 5 and 19. This service is called ParentLine 5-19 and parents will be able to gain advice from a member of the School Nursing team via text message for topics such as Development, Healthy Eating, Weight Management, Behaviour Management, Emotional Health and Wellbeing, Toileting, Sleep and more.



### How it works:

- Parent sends a text message to the ParentLine 5-19 number **07312 263131** and an automated reply confirms the message has been received.
- A trained healthcare professional from the School Nursing team will respond to the message between 9am and 4pm Monday to Friday (excluding weekends, bank holidays and School Holidays) within 24 working hours.
- Please be advised this this should not be used as an emergency service urgent help should be sought from an NHS walk-in centre or call NHS 111, or in an emergency, dial 999 or go to A&E.



### WE REMEMBER – WINTON'S POPPY PROJECT

The ceramic poppies you may have seen on display at Charminster Library were produced by Year 5 & 6 pupils as part of a community project called We Remember. The project was part funded by the Cultural Hub, a collective of schools and creative partners in Bournemouth.

The children attended workshops run by local ceramicist Maisie Jones from The Touring Potter. As well as the traditional red poppies, which remind us of members of the armed forces that sacrificed themselves during wars and conflicts, there are also purple poppies to remember animals that have died in service of

the country and white poppies, that remember all victims of war and stands as a commitment to ongoing peace. As well as Winton, children from St Katharine's and St Luke's primary schools have also made poppies and, with the help of Louise Jones, Libraries Literacy Officer at BCP council, have also been able to display their work in their local libraries. A very big thank you to everyone involved who helped make this project possible.
