Topic Overview

During our topic, we will learn what world trade is and how it became global. We will gain an understanding of how trade has changed over time, and will link our learning to our historical knowledge of World War II: considering how trade was impacted both during and post-war. As Geographers, we will be researching how countries are interconnected and interdependent, with a particular focus on imports and exports. To help us understand this, we will explore geographical diversity, using a range of maps and aerial images to consider the importance of physical features. We will also investigate how and why some countries around the world are changing in line with the concept of Fairtrade and sustainability. As scientists, we will learn about how nutrients and water are transported around the body and link this to the importance of looking after ourselves. As artists, we will be learning about perspective, movement and pattern, before moving onto designing and creating our own mosaic coasters. In religious education, we will be answering the question 'Does belief in Akhirah help Muslims lead a good life?' We will build on our knowledge of Islam and deepen our understanding of what some Muslims believe happens after death. During our PSHE lessons, we will be learning about different relationships as well as how to maintain and develop positive experiences with others.
