### OFSTED REPORT

I am pleased to say the report from the recent inspection is now available and can be viewed here:

As you can see inspectors judged the school to remain good. With results across the school last year being notably above national averages and in the top 1% of schools at Key Stage 2, that is very much what we expected.

We are delighted that pupil, parent and staff surveys were overwhelmingly positive. It is also pleasing that inspectors recognised the pride, hardworking ethos and responsibility of our pupils. Staff were praised for the strength of relationships built and the range of opportunities on offer to children. Our curriculum was praised and specific comments were made about reading, attendance and personal development.

Inspectors set a couple of improvement points which the school will work hard to address over the next year. One related to the consistency of approach when teaching phonics. We will look at developing this next year and would reassure parents that although this is something we can improve further we expect outcomes, like last year, to be above the national average and evidence the success of the phonic scheme and teaching. The other improvement point relates to our curriculum documentation and this is something that we can put in place and address quickly.

We were reassured that inspectors did not find any detriment in pupil outcomes and identified the current curriculum as successful in delivering good outcomes however we can implement the changes to our curriculum to ensure it as good as it can be.

### BOOK AMNESTY – PLEASE HELP!

Please can we ask that you take a look around your homes this weekend and get the children looking in their bedrooms to see what school books you can unearth? Our bookshelves across the school, in particular Year 6, are looking rather empty which is limiting the reading choices for children. Books can be returned via the classroom or the office. 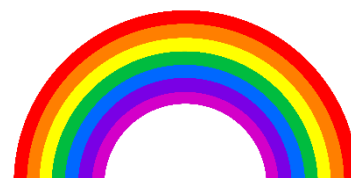


- ✓ Children in 5HP have been involved in various fundraising schemes, including the making and selling of clay bracelets, raising £157.94!

Children can only attend if you have bought them a ticket. Physical tickets will not be issued, names will be checked against bookings at the start of each disco.

For the Reception and Year 1 discos, children should bring their disco clothes to school with them in a named bag, they will then get changed ahead of the disco starting and they will be escorted there by staff, you do not need to collect them from the classroom.

Children who attend St Claire's on their disco days will be dropped off/collected as required. If they are going to the disco from St Claire's, please send them to school with their disco clothes and money. Please advise the St Claire's staff if your child is attending a disco.

At the end of the disco, children are to be collected from the back of the hall, entering via the middle car-park courtyard gates.

Children can bring money with them to buy sweets/snacks & disco toys. We recommend £3 maximum (£5 for Year 6s as they have leavers bracelets they can purchase).

If your child is in Reception or Year 1 or going to St Claire's, please ensure their money comes into school in a named purse/wallet and is handed to their teacher in the morning. The teacher will return the purse at the end of the school day.
