# Review of the year

At the end of the academic year, it is always good to look back at the year and there is a huge amount for us to be proud of as a school community. We have seen children be successful across the curriculum and in a wide range of areas. We recently saw the Year 6 performance of Peter Pan which was a lovely final project for our leavers to work on, and they produced a brilliant performance. This week we also saw about 100 children perform in the music concert showcasing their instrumental work through the year. They showed bravery and a cool head to perform in front of a large audience – some excellent individual and group performances that reflect an awful lot of hard work. These are just a few examples there are lots of successes across a range of areas that we could highlight.

#### **School performance**

Collectively children have done well across the school, and performance in the Early Years Foundation Stage and Year 1 phonic screen was above national averages and reflected good progress for those cohorts. Children in Year 4 did similarly well in the Multiplication Check, performing well compared to national averages. Our Year 6 children excelled themselves in their SAT tests and a summary table of all this data is shown below

When I arrived in 2012 the school was graded as requires improvement but the potential that Winton offered was obvious from my first day. Many headteachers do not get the opportunity to work with such motivated and engaged pupils and such a supportive community and for this I am genuinely grateful. I was lucky that the school was expanding to double in size and over the first few years we were able to rebuild and extend the school. This allowed us to have the physical and staffing resource that we wanted. # **PFA Information**


We have had an absolutely incredible year of fundraising, we raised a very impressive sum in excess of £25,000 for the year! WOW!
