Year 6 Autumn Curriculum Overview

Key Learning			
Reading	Our texts in Talk for Reading will be: 'Holes' by Louis Sachar, where we will be exploring the themes of bravery, friendship and justice. 'Coraline' by Neil Gaiman, where we will be exploring the themes of the journey of discovery and growth. We will also be reading two poetry books: 'Sensational Poetry' and 'Overheard in a Tower Block'.		
Writing	Our stimulus in writing will be based upon our two class texts. This term, we will be writing a non-chronological report, letters, a diary entry and a narrative which includes speech.		
Maths	In maths, we will be learning: -Number and place value including reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers to at least 10,000,000 and determining the value of each digitAddition and subtraction multi-step problems using a range of different contexts and choosing which methods to use and why Multiplication using formal methods to multiply 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers and use these to solve problems in context Division using a written method of long multiplication to divide numbers up to 4 digits by a 2 digit whole number Fractions- using common factors to simplify fractions and using common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination Understanding percentages and calculating percentages of amounts Time problems involving converting between units of time Geometry- illustrating and naming parts of circles, including radius, diameter and circumference and knowing that the diameter is twice the radius.
