Head Lice Advice



Head lice and nits are common in young children.

They are nothing to be embarrassed, upset, or ashamed about.



Check regularly for head lice and nits



You can treat head lice without seeing a GP.

To remove nits and head lice, use a special fine-toothed comb on wet, conditioned hair.



Head lice and nits are very common in primary-aged children. They are not related to cleanliness and there is no need to feel embarrassed or worried.

Regular checking and prompt treatment help stop head lice spreading within school and at home.

What to do if you find head lice:

- Check your child's hair weekly.
- Treat head lice as soon as they are found – you do not need to see a GP.
- Use wet-combing with a fine-toothed nit comb, or a clinically proven lotion or spray.
- Check all close family members on the same day and treat anyone who has live lice.

What we ask parents to do:

- Ensure long hair is tied back for school.
- Check your child's hair every week at home.

- Begin treatment promptly if you find live head lice.
- Continue wet combing every few days until no live lice are found.
- Let school staff know if your child is being treated for head lice.
- Remind children to avoid head-to-head contact where possible.

What we do in school:

- If school staff notice live head lice in a child's hair, parents will be informed and asked to begin treatment promptly.
- We encourage children to avoid head-to-head contact where possible.
