Tasks include removing equipment from storage, collecting non-uniform day donations (details below), distributing pre-sold game tokens to classrooms, setting up game stalls, displaying signage, pre-preparing candy floss, and directing external stallholders to their allocated spaces on the field.

During the fayre, we will also need support with running refreshments, including the BBQ and candy floss stalls, followed by helping to clear and pack away at the end of the event.

Some companies will also offer Match Funding:

Match funding is a simple way of maximising the fundraising efforts where organisations (such as supermarkets, banks, building societies, insurance companies, utility providers, phone companies and high street stores) will 'match' the fund-raising efforts we raise at an event or on a particular stall and donate this to us, the PFA. It costs you as the employee nothing but means extra monies raised for us for no extra work!



It is as simple as approaching your HR department and finding out if they offer match funding or volunteering days.
